1 Introduction

An experiment of the trainers' training was run under AP coordination to ensure that trainers have all the necessary elements to themselves monitor the training sessions for the trainees.

The trainers followed the online content developed in WP3, related to content use and in class activities, and then had a quick look at the online training dedicated to the trainees, provided by task 3.4, in order to have a broad idea about the training content they have to use later. The content providers (INFOR, EFB, UCLM, UNITO, AP, CERTH, PA) provided support on issues related to it. They had 2 weeks to look at the online material.

After the online phase, they participated at the in-class training dedicated to them. It lasted 3 days and took place at AP premises.

Each stakeholder representative of Agriculture, Forestry and Bioeconomy and VET centre (AC3A, ACTIA, AERES, AP, CEPI, CONFAGRI, CONFAGRI PT, UHOH, EFB, GAIA, ICOS, INFOR, LVA, PA, SCOOP, UCLM, UNITO) will provide one trainer and cover its expenses for attending the transnational in-class activity event.

Feedback was expected from this experience in order to implement modifications of the trainers' training were necessary. One satisfaction survey on the activity was prepared by AP with the collaboration of UNITO and the training centres. Feedbacks were collected from this pilot in order to consider modifications of the training content and to help the definition of the country roadmaps in T2.4.

AP collected and organised the feedback of the trainers to be considered while optimising the trainers' training version.

2 Results of the Train the Trainer Session

The Train the Trainer Sessions were arranged according to the agenda. According to the registrations and attendance lists up to 22 trainers followed the training per day. A total of 23 trainers, from 11 European Countries (Austria, Belgium, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Ireland, Italy, Netherlands, Portugal, Spain) have attended the training session.



Due to the design of the agenda, each Trainer got familiar with the training content and the use of it. The practical orientation allowed each Trainer to leave the training session with a draft to a training pilot, the first step to a future training and the sustainable use of FIELDS training material.

Following training pilot drafts were developed:

- NL (AERES): Poultry breeding, full course for agricultural students
- A (AP, BLT, LVA): Sustainability - biomass heating plant operation, HACCP in food industry, digitalisation - operation of digital hardware
- I (CONFAGRI, INFOR-ELEA): full course
- ESP, PT, I (UCLM, Confagri PT, CONFAGRI): Irrigation
- FR (AC3A): Conservation farming, Organisation/Planning/SMART objectives, Organisation, Planning, Prioritisation of Work
- FI (ProAgria): Basic training for advisors and trainers, Introduction to entrepreneurship, understanding the bioeconomy, sustainability, what is digitalisation, lifelong learning and continuous learning CPD
- UHOH (ICOS): Bioeconomy course

2.1 Results on the evaluation of the Train the Trainer Session

- sustainability presentation

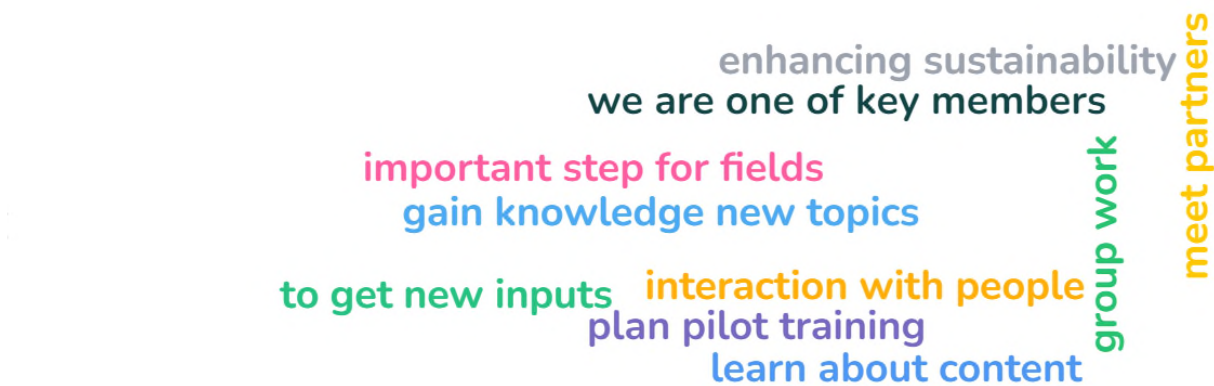

3 Conclusion

The Train the Trainers Session was successful, many people participated, from different EU countries, even from outside the project. 23 trainers of the project consortium and beyond from the countries Austria, Belgium, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Ireland, Italy, Netherlands, Portugal, Spain were trained.

Even the results of the survey (22 survey questionnaires were submitted and analysed) shows that the presentations of the different tasks and the organisation of the Train the Trainer Session were mostly graded as good or very good. The total average of the points for the presentations were 4,4 from 5 points.

The open question feedback reflects the results of the graded results about the presentation. The feedback is in general very positive, and mirrors the atmosphere during the Train the Trainer Session.
